


Camping Adventure

BEFORE READING Talk together

- Look at the title and cover. Ask: What do you think the family are doing?
- Talk together about any times you or your child have been camping. Ask: What do you like about camping?
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

About the words in this book

 Your child should be able to sound out and blend some words, which may include:

house day made came here very helicopter blew camping

Some words may be more challenging. Encourage or model blending, then read the words below to your child if necessary.

Mr Mrs looked called could laughed water


DURING READING

Enjoy the story together. If your child needs support to read the story:

- Remind your child to sound out and blend unfamiliar words from left to right.
- Look for compound words, where two words create a bigger word, e.g. moonlight.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Re-read sentences to focus on their meaning where necessary.





Mum and Dad had a new tent. They put it up. Wilf helped.




Wilma got some water.
"I like it here," she said. "I like camping."




Mr Jones was the farmer. He had to milk the cows.

"Come and watch," he said.




"What a lot of cows!" said Wilf.

"We milk them every day," he said.




Mum wanted some milk. She went to the farmhouse.

"I want some eggs too," said Mum.




Mrs Jones was expecting a baby. She was expecting it soon.


"It may come today," she said.




Dad cooked supper.

fun in this tent."




Everyone went to bed but there was a storm. Nobody could sleep.




The wind blew. Everyone had to get up.

The storm got worse. The wind blew and blew. The wind blew a big tree down.




The car couldn't get past.

Mr Jones called for help. He called the hospital.


"A helicopter's coming," he said.

They made a big cross out of the bags. They put stones on the bags.




The helicopter came. It landed near the cross.

There was a doctor in the helicopter.


"Come on!" said Mr Jones.


