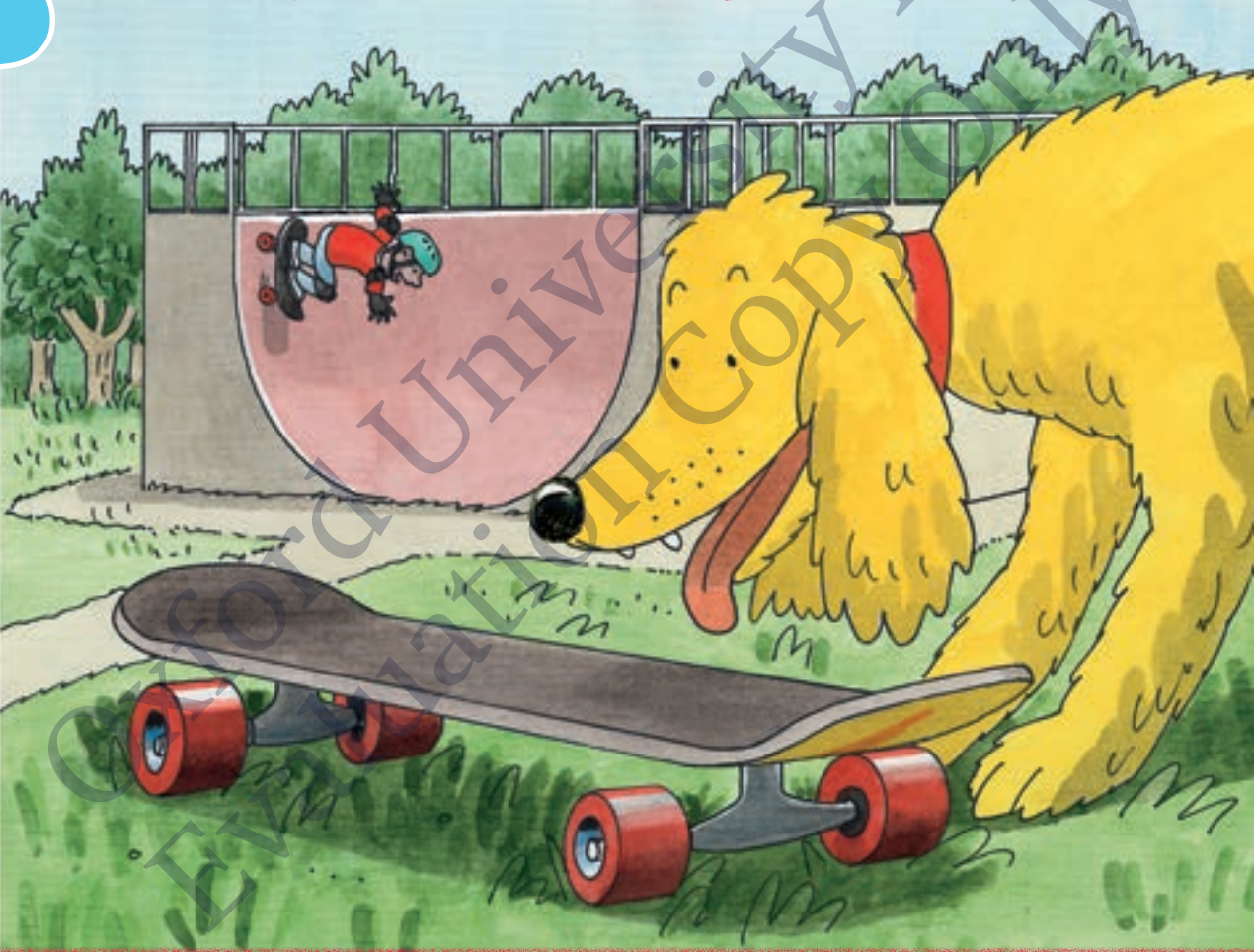


Floppy and the Skateboard

BEFORE READING

Talk together

- Read the title and look at the picture.
Ask: *What do you think will happen in this story?*
- Talk about what you can do on a skateboard. Ask: *Why is Wilf wearing a helmet?*
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

About the words in this book

- Your child should be able to sound out and blend some words, which may include:

went children park jump
turn trick ramp stood
kept pond splash

- Some words may be more challenging. Encourage or model blending, then read the words below to your child if necessary.

were do have
said wanted
skateboard shouted



DURING READING

Enjoy the story together.
If your child needs support to read the story:

- Remind your child to sound out and blend unfamiliar words from left to right.
- Look for compound words, where two words create a bigger word, e.g. *moonlight*.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Re-read sentences to focus on their meaning where necessary.

- Look at the pictures of the children on their skateboards on pages 2 to 5. Ask: *Who do you think is the best at skateboarding? Why might this be so?*
- Ask: *Why couldn't anyone stop Floppy?*
- Ask: *Have you ever been on a skateboard? If not, would you like to have a go on one?*
