
DURING READING

Enjoy the story together, If your child needs support to read the story:


- Remind your child to sound out and blend unfamiliar words from left to right.
- Look for compound words, where two words create a bigger word, e.g. *moonlight*.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Re-read sentences to focus on their meaning where necessary.





The Robinson family went on holiday to Scotland.




"The mountains seem to go on forever," said Chip. "This part of Scotland is fantastic."



Kipper drew a picture of the mountains. Biff took a photo.




"Look at that big sign," said Biff.
"It says 'Highland Games'."




"Let's go and watch them," said Dad. "It will be fun."




A band of pipers was playing.

Chip.




"What a fantastic sound," said Biff. "And they are wearing kilts."




"These men are throwing hammers," said Dad. "Let's watch how they throw them."

"That man is tossing the caber," said Dad. "Watch how he throws it."




"Phew!" said Kipper. "What a throw!



A man lifted an enormous log. It was the biggest log of all, and he was the winner.




"He must be really strong," said Chip. "I bet Dad can't do that."




A woman spoke to them.

Biff and Chip won a race.


Kipper came second in a race.

"Your turn, Dad," they all said.






"I'll show you," said Dad.
"I'll throw the hammer."




"This is just for fun," said a man.
"You must put on a kilt to do it."







Then he let go.
