## BEFORE READING Talk together

- Read the title and blurb together. Find the seal pup in the picture. Ask: What do you think might happen in this story?
- Look at page 5 and talk about why Dad looks tired. Explain that it is necessary to wait 24 hours before calling for help for a lost animal, so it is now the next day.
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

#### About the words in this book

- Your child should be able to sound out and blend some words, which may include:
   help went children sand
  - help went children sand wait lost sent must boat
- Some words may be more challenging.
   Encourage or model blending, then read the words below to your child if necessary.


### **DURING READING**

Enjoy the story together. If your child needs support to read the story:


- Remind your child to sound out and blend unfamiliar words from left to right.
- Look for compound words, where two words create a bigger word, e.g. moonlight.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Re-read sentences to focus on their meaning where necessary.


A seal pup was on the sand. "It has no mother!" said Chip.




"Perhaps the mother is getting food," said Mum.



"But what if the pup is lost?" asked Biff.




"Let's wait to see if the mother comes back," said Dad.




But the mother did not come back. So, in the end, Dad sent for help.

Mrs Hill and her team got the seal pup into the boat.




"He is not well," said Mrs Hill.

The children went back to see Sinbad. He was big and fit.




"Now he can go back in the sea," said Mrs Hill.
