


The Weather

BEFORE READING Talk together

- Look at the cover and read the title together. Ask: Why is Wilma wearing a hard hat? Where do you think she is?
- Explain that a weather vane shows the direction of the wind.
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

About the words in this book

 Your child should be able to sound out and blend some words, which may include:

went back cab man roof see took van

Some words may be more challenging.
 Encourage or model blending, then read the words below to your child if necessary.

said what came looked building careful crane idea jumped photograph



DURING READING

Enjoy the story together. If your child needs support to read the story:

- Remind your child to sound out and blend unfamiliar words from left to right.
- Look for compound words, where two words create a bigger word, e.g. moonlight.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Re-read sentences to focus on their meaning where necessary.





They looked at the crane.




Wilma spoke to the man in the cab.




A van came to the building site.




It had a weather vane on the back.




Wilf looked at the weather vane.



Dad had an idea.




Wilf jumped over the weather vane.




"Be careful," said Dad.




"Take a photograph," said Wilma.



She jumped over the weather vane.




The weather vane went on the roof.
