BEFORE READING Talk together

- Read the title together. Ask: Have you ever seen a rescue helicopter? How do they help people?
- Ask: Who do you think might need rescuing in this story?
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

Some words may be more challenging. Encourage or model blending, then read the words below to your child if necessary.


DURING READING

Enjoy the story together. If your child needs support to read the words:

- Ask your child to point from left to right under each word whilst reading.
- Model how to sound out and blend new words if necessary.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Use the pictures to talk about the story and learn the meaning of new words.





The children went into the helicopter.




They saw the cockpit.

"It's a call-out," said the man.




"We must rescue a boat."



The helicopter took off.




"Look! That is the boat," said Mum.



The helicopter went to the boat.




It had hit a rock.
