BEFORE READING

Talk together

- Look at the cover and read the title together. Ask: *Is this a real elephant?*
- Talk about what it might be and why it is flying.
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

About the words in this book

- Your child should be able to sound out and blend some words, which may include:
**went it's children flat
roof shopping storm
strong wind**
- Some words may be more challenging. Encourage or model blending, then read the words below to your child if necessary.

**said there liked blew
elephant funny
laughed playground
rained sorry stay**



DURING READING

Enjoy the story together.
If your child needs support to read the story:

- Remind your child to sound out and blend unfamiliar words from left to right.
- Look for compound words, where two words create a bigger word, e.g. *moonlight*.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Re-read sentences to focus on their meaning where necessary.

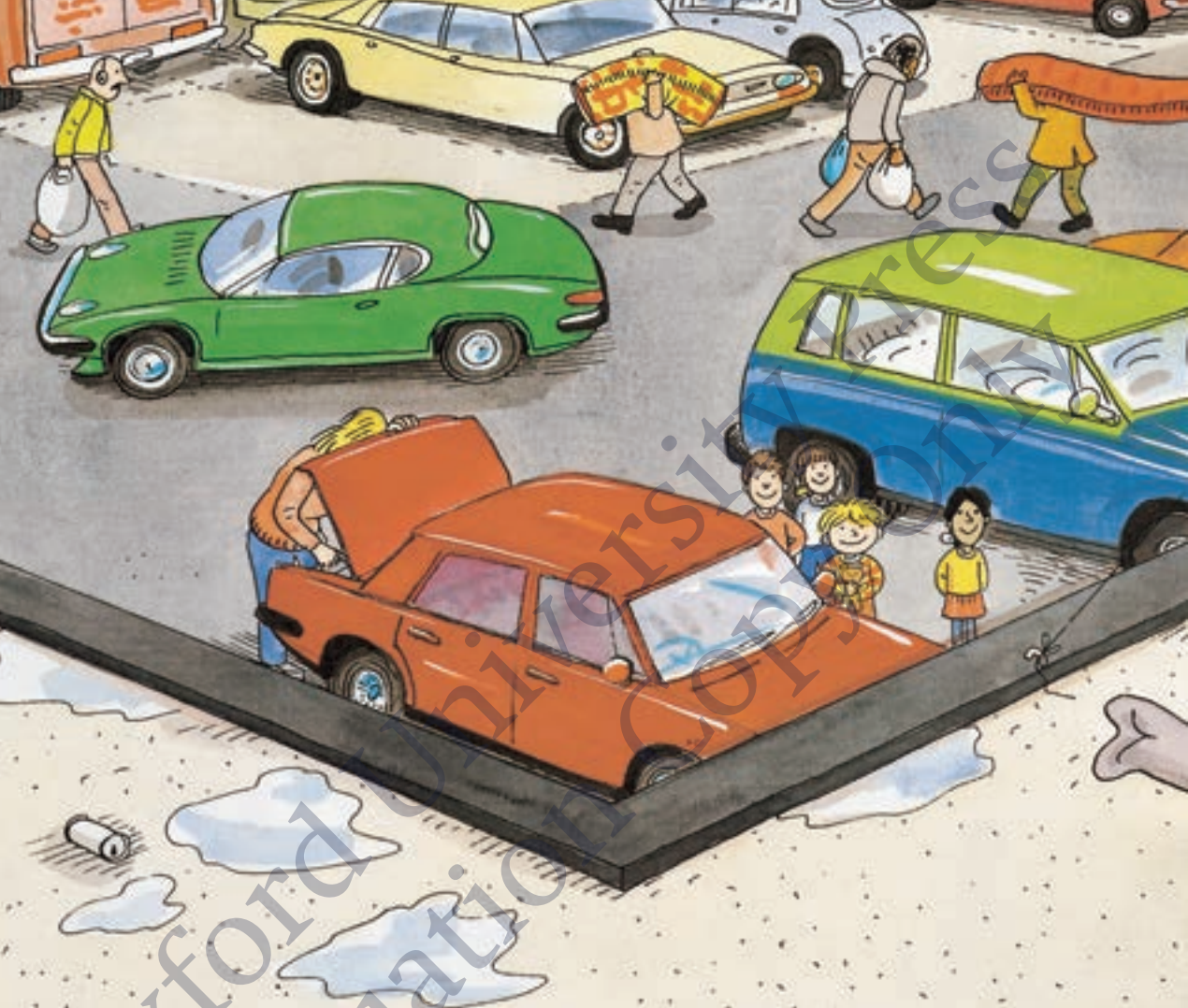

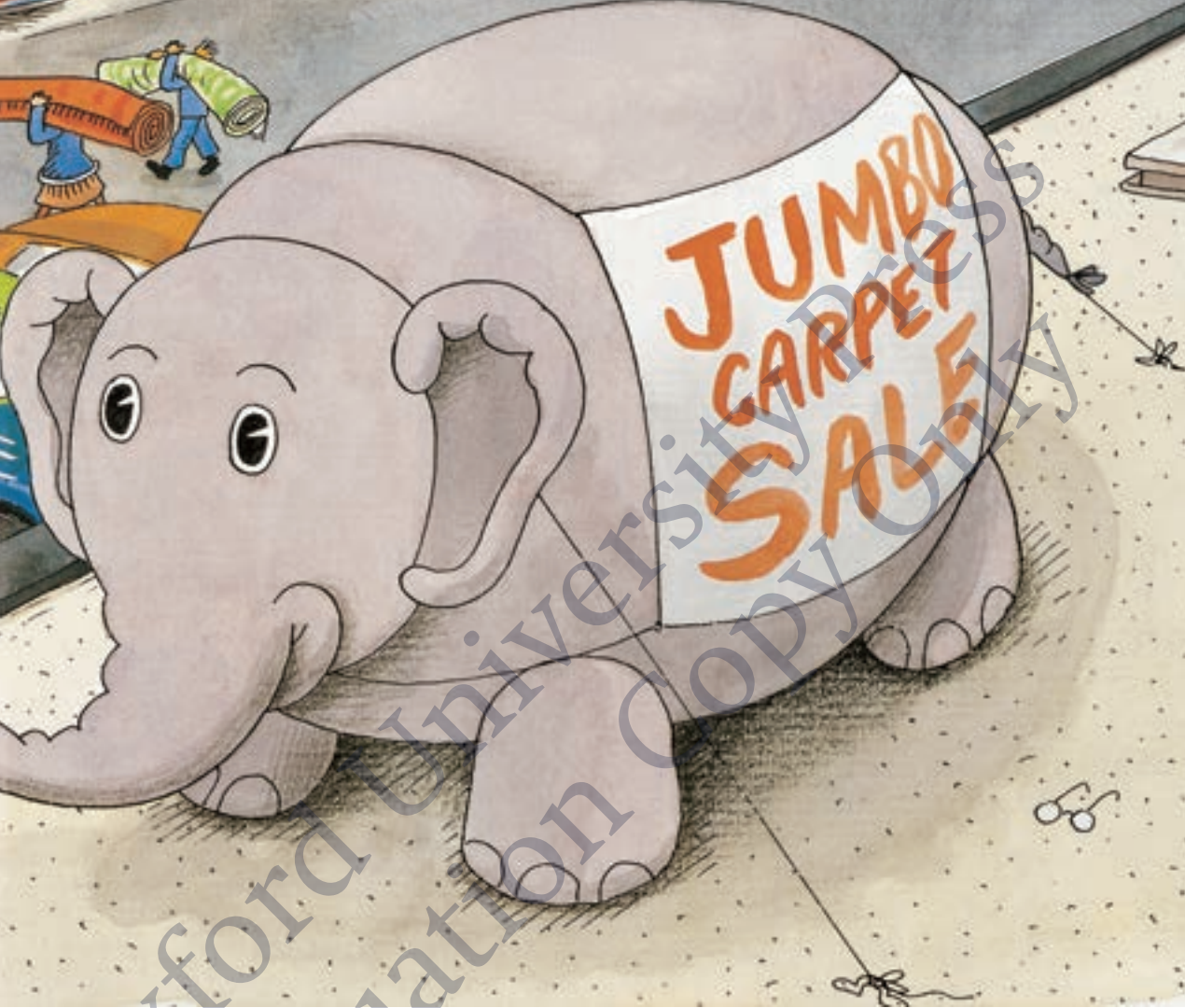
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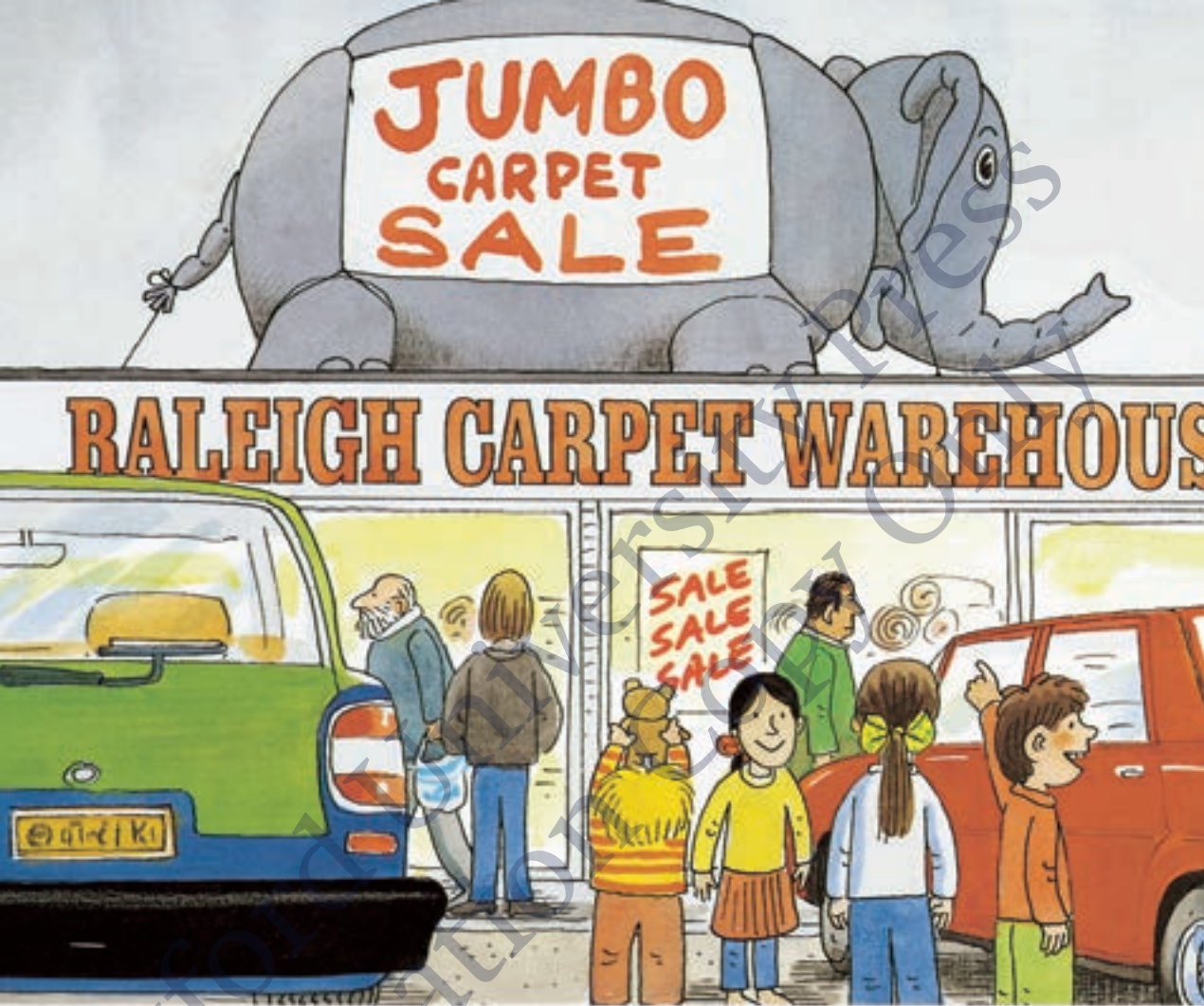
Mum went shopping. She took the children.

It blew the elephant away.



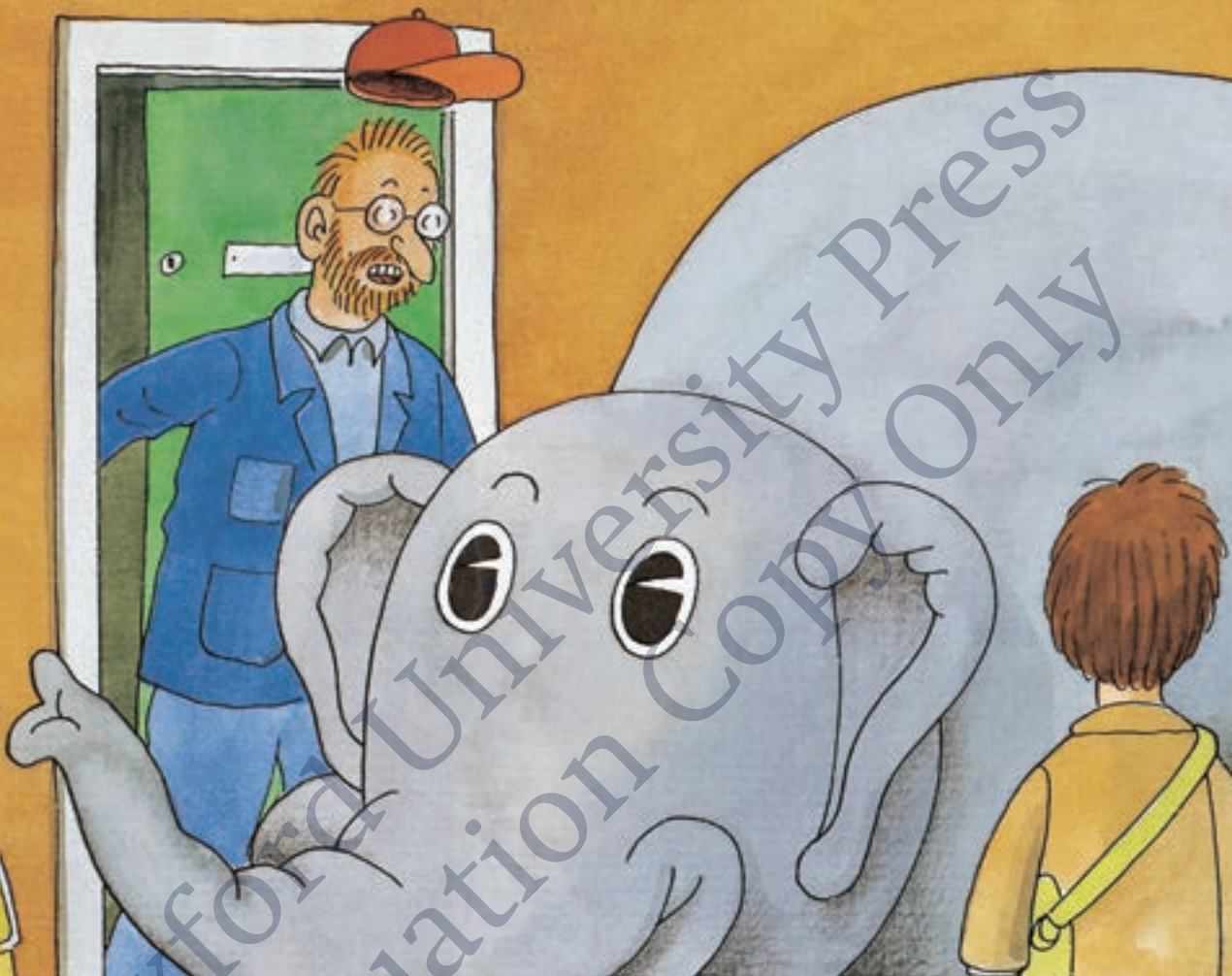
The children went to school. The elephant was in the playground.



The children laughed.



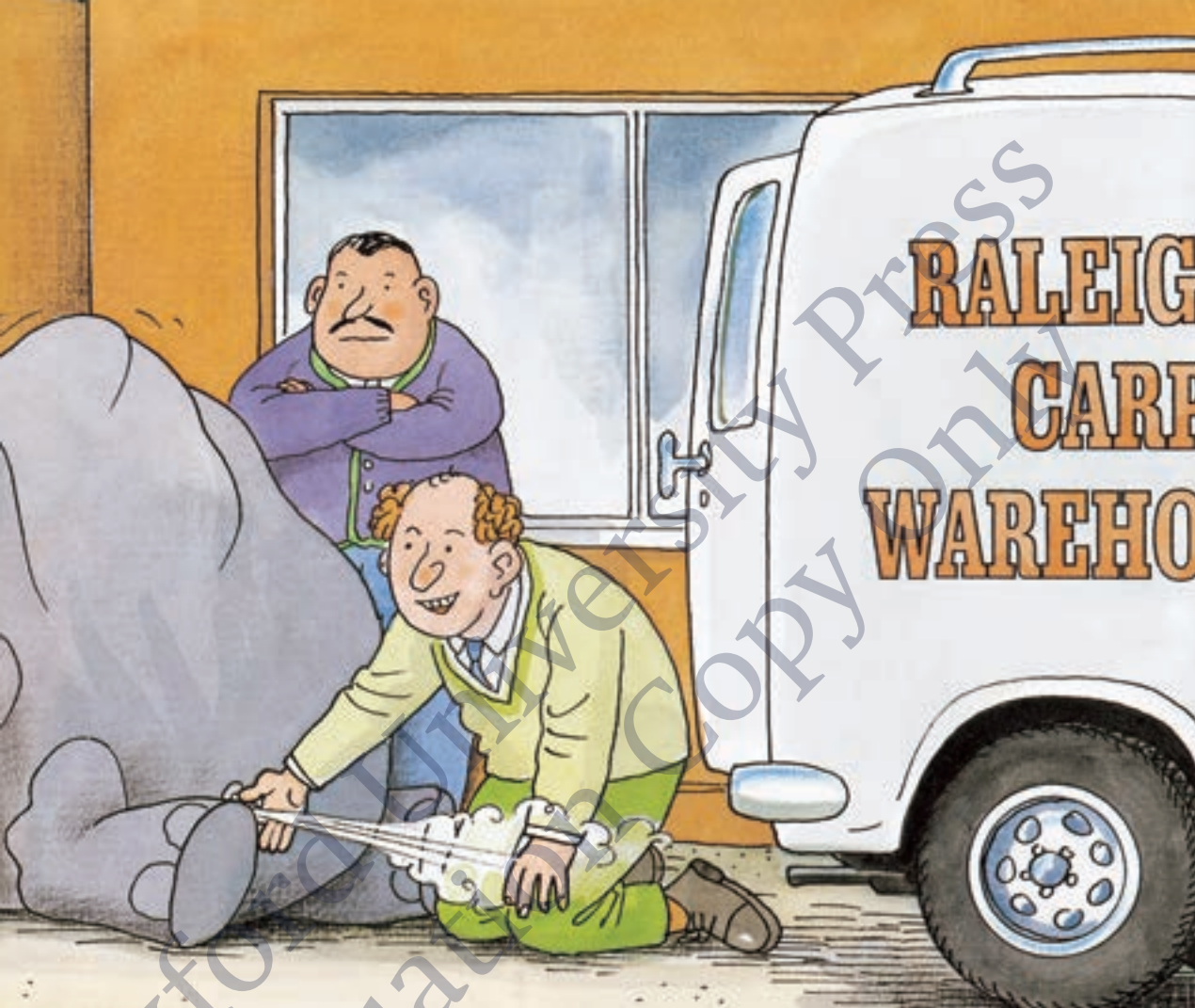
The children told Mrs May.

- Look at page 16 and ask your child to tell you which letter has been added to *fat* to make *flat*.
