## BEFORE READING Talk together

- Look at the cover and read the title together. Ask: What do you think this story is about?
- Ask: What characters are the children dressed up as?
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

scarecrow witch




#### **DURING READING**

Enjoy the story together. If your child needs support to read the story:

- Remind your child to sound out and blend unfamiliar words from left to right.
- Look for compound words, where two words create a bigger word, e.g. moonlight.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Re-read sentences to focus on their meaning where necessary.






Biff and Chip went to school.

It was story time.




The story was The Wizard of Oz. It was about a girl and her dog.



The girl was Dorothy.




There was a storm. The wind blew the house away.

Mrs May put on a play. The play was The Wizard of Oz.




Wilf's mum helped Mrs May.

Biff was a witch.




Wilf's dad helped Mrs May. He painted a house.
