## BEFORE READING Talk together

- Read the title together. Ask: What is Dad doing? What do you think will happen in this story?
- Talk about what happens to your rubbish, where you put it and who takes it away.
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

 Encourage or model blending, then read the words below to your child if necessary.


### **DURING READING**

Enjoy the story together. If your child needs support to read the words:

- Ask your child to point from left to right under each word whilst reading.
- Model how to sound out and blend new words if necessary.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Use the pictures to talk about the story and learn the meaning of new words.




Mum got the shopping.

Dad put the shopping in the bin.






Mum ran to the bin men.

#### AFTER READING

   Talk about why 'Scrambled' is funny.
- Ask: Which was your favourite part of the story?
   What did you like about it?
