


Identify Verbs




Carry and **ship** are **action verbs**. An action verb tells what someone or something does.

The workers **carry** boxes. We **ship** goods on planes.

quarter = twenty-five cents 25¢





Subject-Verb Agreement: be and have

Some **verbs** do not show action, such as **be** and **have**.

The truck is big. The truck has a flat tire. tells about one thing

The boxes are heavy. The boxes have cans in them.

tells about more than one thing

Grammar Rules Subject-Verb Agreement

be in present tense

To tell about one person, place, or thing, use is.

To tell about more than one, use are.

have in present tense

To tell about one person, place, or thing, use has.

To tell about more than one, use have.
