Shoes to You: A How-to



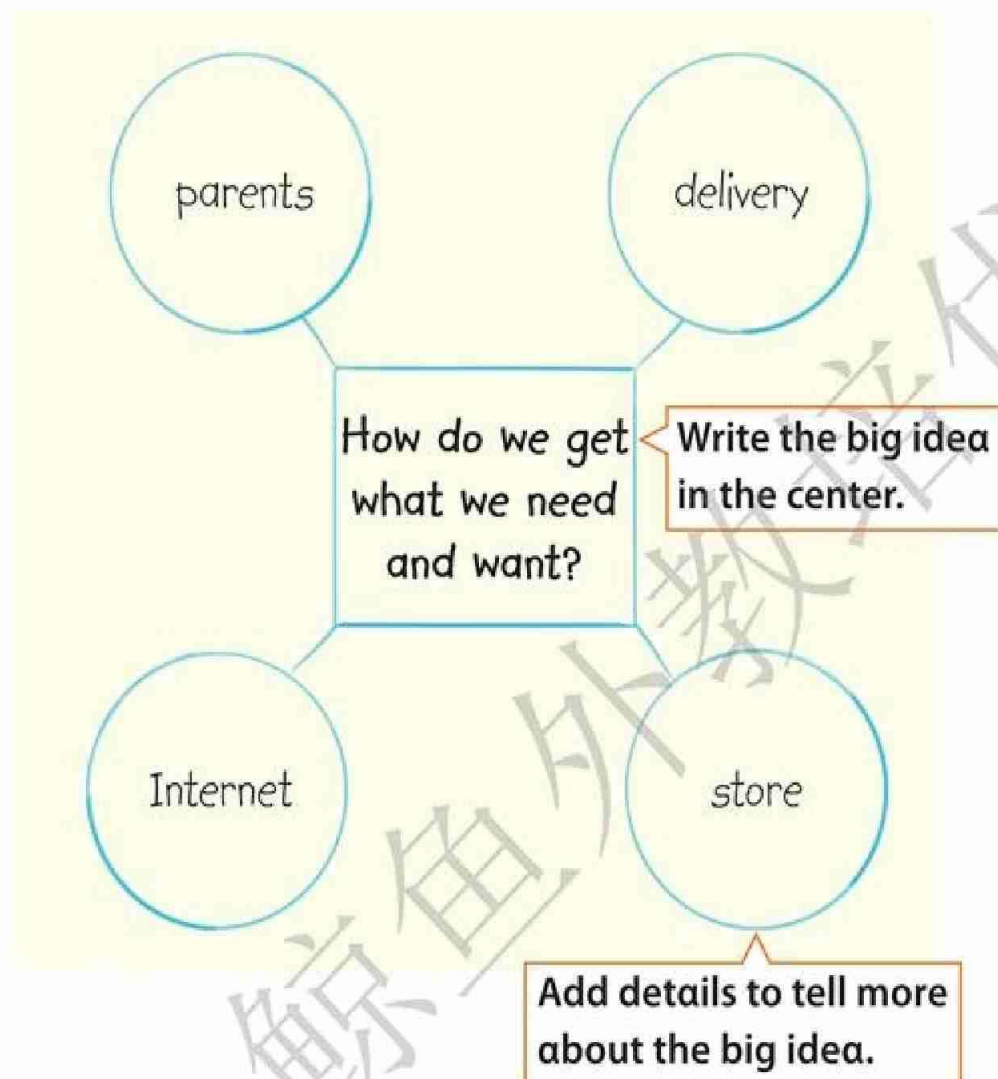
1. Make it in a **factory**.

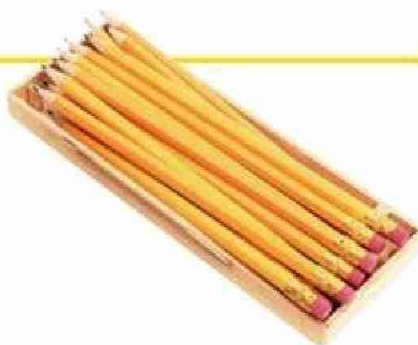

Subject-Verb Agreement: *be* and *have*

Some **verbs** do not show action, such as **be** and **have**.

The truck **is** big. The truck **has** a flat tire.

tells about one thing

The boxes **are** heavy. The boxes **have** cans in them.

tells about
more than
one thing

Grammar Rules Subject-Verb Agreement

be in present tense

To tell about one person, place, or thing, use **is**.

To tell about more than one, use **are**.

have in present tense

To tell about one person, place, or thing, use **has**.

To tell about more than one, use **have**.
