





A compass is a tool that can tell which direction you are going. There are four main directions: North, South, East, and West.




Materials sewing needle clear container water bar magnet plastic foam cup paper crayons scissors

Step I

Cut out the bottom of the foam cup so you have a flat circle.

Step 2

Magnetize the needle. Rub it the same direction on the bar magnet 20 times.




Step 3

Lay the needle on the foam circle.

Put the foam and the needle in the water. The needle will stop moving when it points **North**.

Move the paper around until the needle lines up with the N on the compass rose.






